
Five circular cycle rides across the South Somerset Moors











The routes described in this publication are centred around the attractive market town of Langport, in the heart of the Somerset Levels. The town is 15 miles east of Taunton and 15 miles north west of Yeovil and is well served with a good selection of accommodation, pubs, cafes and independent shops.

#### Start and finish

All the routes start and finish in the Cocklemoor Carpark in the centre of Langport (TA10 9RG), and follow quiet country roads and off road byways, however it is possible to start from anywhere along the routes. Ordnance Survey maps Explorer 128 (Taunton and Blackdown Hills) and 129 (Yeovil and Sherborne) might be useful to assist with directions and to extend any of the routes.

Explore classic South Somerset landscapes in a circular ride which takes you out towards Muchelney Abbey.



1 Leave the Cocklemoor car park onto riverbank. Right along path and over footbridge by Shakspeare Glass. Left to end of road. Left onto Parrett cycleway and follow a short distance to Huish Drove. 2 Right then left to continue along cycleway for 11/4 miles to road. 3 Left at road towards Muchelnev. Left at junction by church towards Langport.

4 Shortly after crossing river. **left** on slight bend by cottage. Road becomes track after crossing river. Continue along Huish Drove for 1/2 mile to meet Parrett Cycleway. Right onto cycleway and through trading estate. Right at Shakspeare Glass. Over footbridge onto Cocklemoor. Right on Cocklemoor to return to the Cocklemoor car park.

A lovely ride on guiet roads to Red Hill, with spectacular views across West Sedgemoor, returning alongside the River Parrett.



1 Leave the Cocklemoor car park onto riverbank. Right along path and over footbridge by Shakspeare Glass. Left to end of road. Left onto Parrett cycleway and follow a short distance to Huish Drove. 2 Right then **left** to continue along Cycleway for 11/4 miles to road. **Right** at road to Drayton. 3 Left shortly after pub into School Street and follow to junction with the B3168. 4 Right onto B3168 towards Curry Rivel. First left after 1/2 mile, not sign posted. 5 First **right** after 1/2 mile, not sign posted and follow to A378.

- 6 Left onto A378 and then immediately right to Heale. (after 1/4 mile Burton Pynsent Monument can be seen on left. This can be reached on foot by taking the footpath alongside a stone wall next to metal gates of 'Stoneleigh'). Left at junction to Oath. Shortly there is a steep descent - check brakes. **Right** at junction just over railway towards Langport to eventually meet the A378.
- 8 Left onto A378 for 1/4 mile. Right onto trading estate. Left by Shakspeare Glass. Over footbridge onto Cocklemoor. Right on Cocklemoor to return to return to Cocklemoor car park.




A route taking in the historic settlements of Langport, Somerton and Muchelney.



1 Leave Parrett Trail Bikes by way of Cocklemoor car park onto riverbank. Right along path and over footbridge by Shakspeare Glass. Left to end of road. Left onto Parrett cycleway and follow a short distance to Huish Drove (track). Left along Huish Drove for 3/4 mile, over river and follow lane to meet road. Left onto road, Right at Junction and Left at Junction on bend along main road. 2 Straight over roundabout to Wearne. Right at Junction into village. 3 Through village, Left at Junction towards High Ham, shortly Right on bend SP to Pitney. 4 Left just after Pitney village sign, Sign posted to Park. Continue through Park to Somerton, approximately 31/2 miles. 5 Left at Junction onto B3153, Right at mini roundabout towards Town Centre. Right at junction opposite Unicorn Hotel into Pesters Lane. Straight over at mini roundabout. After 1/2 mile.

6 Right at crossroads, not Sign posted. 7 Left at second crossroads. Straight over at crossroads with main road, Sign posted to Bineham. Follow road through Knole to Long Sutton to eventually meet main road. 8 Left at crossroads onto B3165 to Long Load. 9 Right at church, Right at next Junction not Sign posted. Through Muchelney Ham, Right at Junction towards church. 10 Left at church near Muchelney (outside main village, near Abbey remains), sign posted to Drayton. Shortly after river, (past cottage) Right onto Parrett cycleway. After 1 mile, go through gate, turn Right then Left to end of cycleway and onto trading estate. Right at Shakspeare Glass. Over footbridge onto Cocklemoor. Right on Cocklemoor. Right on Cocklemoor to return to Cocklemoor car park.

A ride through attractive villages, passing orchards and the heart of the local cider industry, returning across the moors.



Leave the Cocklemoor car park onto riverbank. Right along path and over footbridge by Shakspeare Glass. Left to end of road. Left onto Parrett cycleway and follow a short distance to Huish Drove. Right then Left to continue along cycleway for 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> miles to road. Right at road to Drayton. Left shortly after pub into School Street and follow to junction with the B3168. Left onto B3168 to Hambridge. Continue on road through Hambridge to Westport. At end of village, Left along Ruskway Lane to Barrington. Left through Barrington towards Shepton Beauchamp Left at crossroads into Shepton. Left at junction by pub to West Lambrook. Through village, up hill


and on sharp bend, **Right** by thatched cottage sign posted to East Lambrook. **6** After last house, **Left** signposted to Stembridge. **7 Right** at main road and follow road through Kingsbury, Thorney and Muchelney. **8 Left** at church near Muchelney (outside main village, near Abbey remains), **sign posted** to Drayton. Shortly after river, (past cottage) **Right** onto Parrett cycleway. After 1 mile, go through gate, turn **Right** then **Left** to end of cycleway and onto trading estate. **Right** at Shakspeare Glass. Over footbridge onto Cocklemoor. **Right** on Cocklemoor to return to Cocklemoor car park.

# A superb ride around West Sedgemoor, through the centre of the local willow industry, returning alongside the River Parrett.



1 Leave the Cocklemoor car park onto riverbank. Right along path and over footbridge by Shakspeare Glass. Left to end of road. Left onto Parrett cycleway and follow a short distance to Huish Drove. Right then left through gate and along Parrett cycleway 1 mile to end. 2 Left shortly after pub into School Street and follow to junction with the B3168. Left onto B3168 to Hambridge. After 11/4 miles 3 Right almost opposite school, signposted to Fivehead. Right at crossroads through Isle Brewers to Fivehead. 4 Left signposted to Curry Mallet. Second right into Stowey Road towards Curry Mallet. Shortly after Curry Mallet village sign, Right signposted to North Curry. 5 Right at junction and then immediately **Left** towards North Curry. **Right** onto A378 (1/2 mile). 6 First left through Helland to North Curry. Right through Meare Green towards Stoke St Gregory. After 2 miles 8 left through Athelney towards Burrowbridge. 9 Right through Stathe towards Oathe. Continue ahead towards Wick and Langport to the A378  $(2^{1}/_{2} \text{ miles})$  10 Left onto A378 for  $^{1}/_{4}$  mile. Right onto trading estate. Left by Shakspeare Glass. Over footbridge onto Cocklemoor. Right on Cocklemoor to return to Cocklemoor car park.

# Safe Cycling

- · Always give way to pedestrians.
- Be considerate to other road and path users, especially in built up areas.
- When travelling in a group, leave a reasonable space between each cyclist.
