Closure of the A303 between Hazelgrove roundabout and Podimore roundabout

As part of the A303 Sparkford to Ilchester dualling scheme, there will be a temporary closure of the A303 in both directions between Hazlegrove and Podimore roundabouts soon. This is to remove the temporary bridge over the A303.

The closure is for the full weekend from **10pm**, **Friday 11** to **5am**, **Monday 14 November**, but access will only remain for emergency services and residents with direct access to the A303. There will be a fully signed diversion route in place to take traffic along the A359 and A37.
